



Cookridge Primary Sports Premium Funding 2017/18

On 17th July 2017 the Department for Education confirmed that the Primary PE & Sport Premium will double from September 2017.

The Department for Education says schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport.

This means that schools should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that their school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

The 2017-2018 Sport Premium funding for our school is received in two separate payments.
