(Communication and Language

<u>Focus</u>: Children listen to stories, accurately anticipating key events

School – We will be predicting storylines in reading and creating

Home – Ask plenty of 'how' and 'why' questions whilst reading.

PD



(Physical Development

<u>Focus</u>: They handle equipment and tools effectively, including pencils for writing and scissors for cutting

<u>School</u> - Activities such as: formation of and letters cutting out Home - Make small controlled movements using a range of

different tools e.g. knife and fork, pens, pencils

(Personal, Social and Emotional Development)

<u>Focus:</u> Children talk about how they and others show feelings, talk about their own and others' behaviour, and its

<u>School –</u> We will be discussing how we respond to people that are displaying different emotions.

At home - Talk to the children about their likes and dislikes

Focus:. Attempts to write short sentences in meaningful contexts.

School – We will be continuing with simple sentences stems – I like..., I am..., This is a and encouraging increasing independence in writing.

Reading: one-to-one reading every week with a teacher.

At home – Attempt to say and write simple sentences in funny/strange

UW



(Understanding the World)

Focus: To look closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change

<u>School</u> – We will be looking closely at similarities and change in animals when we get our baby chicks.

<u>At home</u> – Talk to children about how things grow. Identify new life in the world.





(<u>Mathematics</u>)
Focus: Shape, space and measure

School: Understanding shape and comparing and ordering by

capacity, height and weight.

<u>At home</u>: Involve children in shopping; paying for things, and collecting the change.



EAD

(Expressive Arts and Design)

<u>Focus:</u> They represent their own ideas, thoughts and feelings through design and technology, art, music, dance, role play and stories

<u>School</u> – We will be making pictures of change and growth.

<u>At home</u> – Use a new material to create something that shows the different stages of a plant or animal's growth
