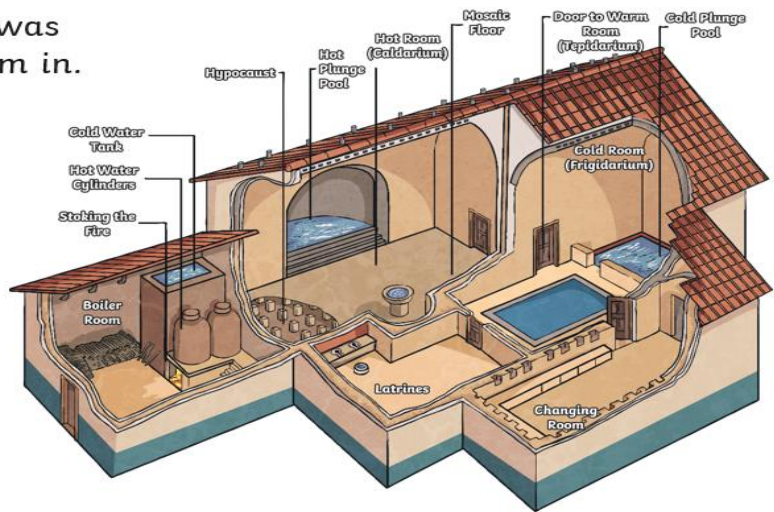




# Roman Baths

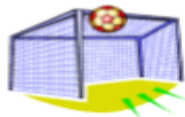
