## What is the PE & Sport Premium for primary schools?

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. Schools receive the funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

We are currently auditing the strengths and weaknesses of PE teaching in our school and aim to provide training to staff that have identified weaknesses in subject knowledge.

We are currently making plans to use Balance-ability in KS1 to compliment Bike-ability that we have run in KS2 for a number of years. We are also using a cycling company to deliver time trial events to our UKS2 pupils after SATS.
