What is a pronoun?

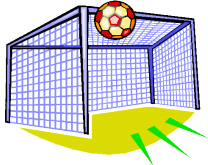
A word used to replace a noun.

Why do we use them?

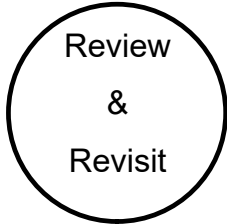
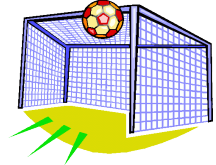
To avoid repetition in writing.

No, only when they start a sentence.



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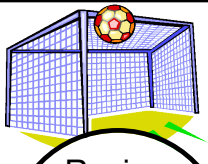

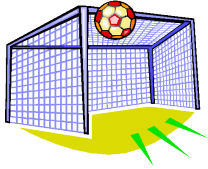
Pronoun Challenge One

In the following paragraph, there are lots of pronouns. Can you circle them all?

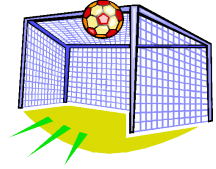

'it' = chocolate



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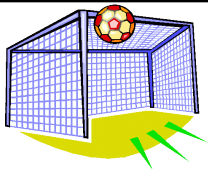

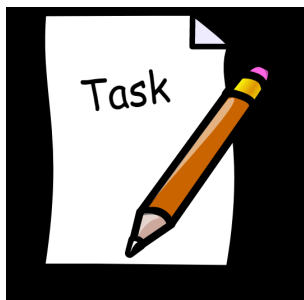
For each sentence, underline the noun and circle the pronoun that it has been replaced with. Look at the example:
