What is a pronoun?

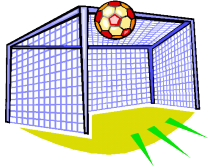
A word used to replace a noun.

Why do we use them?

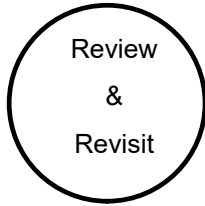
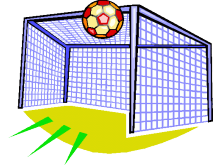
To avoid repetition in writing.

No, only when they start a sentence.



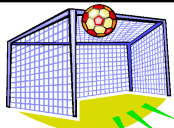
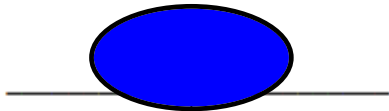
