




# Handwriting






Look at the different pictures and write the word next to it.


Once you have completed your first challenge, can you use one or more than one of the words in a sentence?

### Our Learning Objective:


I can segment spoken words into phoneme and represent these by graphemes, spelling <u>many</u> correctly.



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Lets look at how the poem is structured.


What can you tell me about how it is set out?
