

Measuring Length, Height and Width - Expected

Today at home, you will be identifying a number of objects of your choice and measuring them.

The idea of this activity is to develop your estimating skills along with how you measure.



Pick a number of objects within your home and have a go at estimating the length, height and width of each.

If you have a ruler or tape measure you can then measure them accurately and see how close you were with your estimating skills.

Remember if you don't have access to a ruler or tape measure, you can always get creative and measure in a different way - maybe use your hands or feet!?

Once complete have a go at the questions below using the same objects you first identified:



1. Can you place the objects in ascending order of their height, length or width?
2. What is the difference in length between the shortest and longest object?
3. What is the total length, width or height of all the objects?
4. Take the longest object. What is twice its length?
5. What is half its length?
6. What is a third of its length?



Get creative with how you present your findings and see if you can come up with any other questions.
