


## Fronted Adverbials


## Can you remember what an adverb is?


An adverb is a word that tells you where, when, why or how something is done.

## Can you remember what a fronted adverbial is?


A fronted adverbial is when the adverbial word or phrase is moved to the front of the sentence, before the verb.

## Fronted Adverbials


In fronted adverbial sentences the comma is mightily important!
