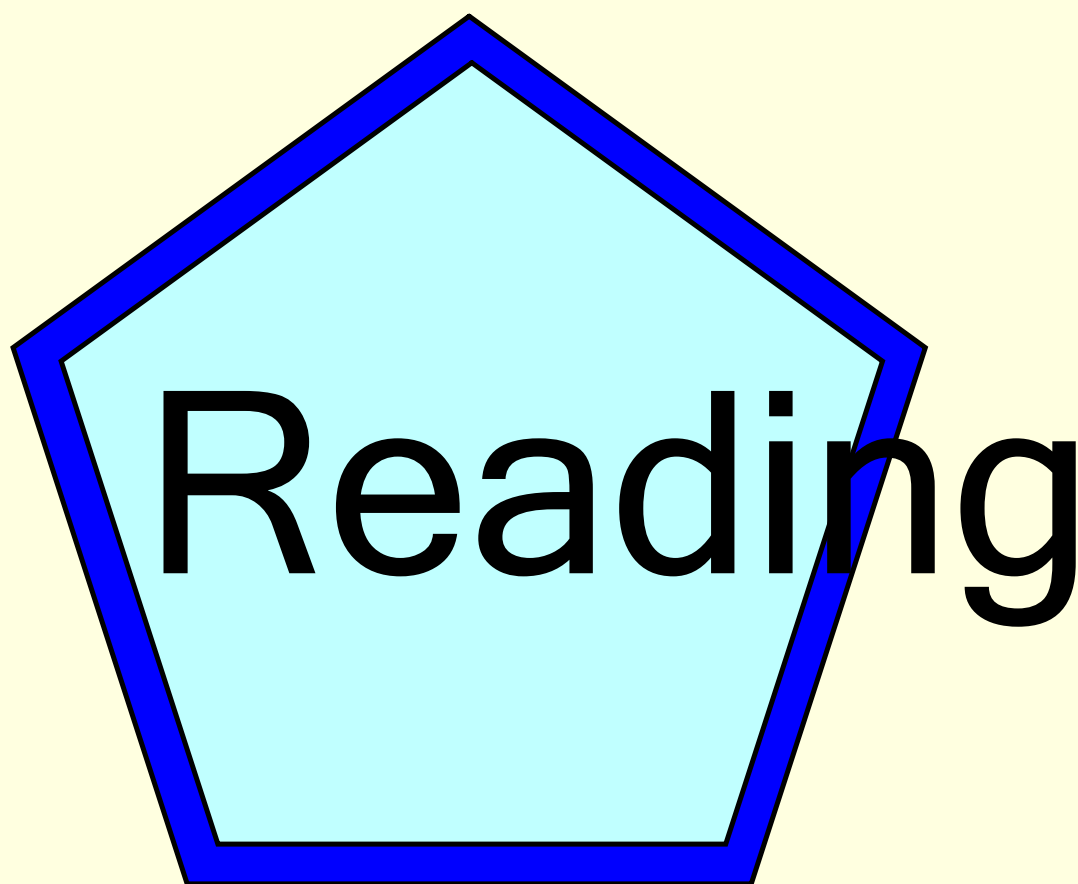

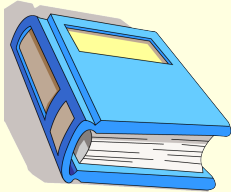

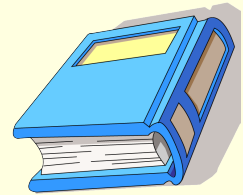

When we write in the past tense,
we add 'ed' to most verbs.



Here is an easy way
to help you
remember this...

Uncle Ed is very old.

He likes to remember things
that happened in the past.

With most verbs, we can add
Uncle Ed's name to change
the verb to the past tense.



I walk^{ed} in the park.



I poured^{ed} the milk on my cereal.



We added 'ed' to pour because Uncle Ed did this in the past!

Can you write a sentence to go with each one?

-ed sometimes we have to double the consonant at the end of a word, before we add -ed.

RULE:

In words of one syllable, that end with a single consonant, with a single vowel before it...

If a word...

has only one syllable

skip

ends with a single consonant

skip

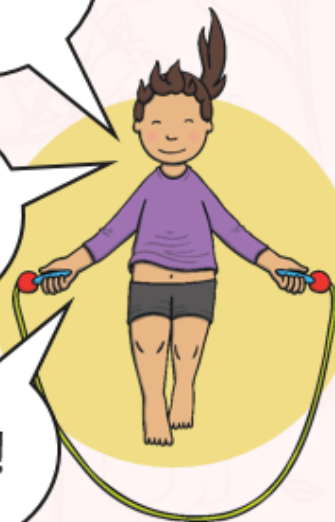
and has a single vowel before the consonant...

skip

then the **consonant** is **doubled** before the suffix (ending) is added.

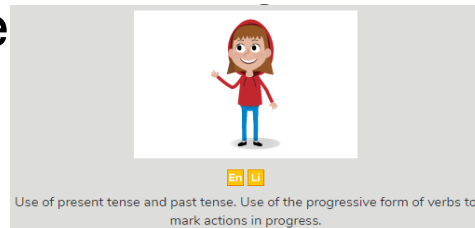
