Today we are going to be continuing looking at adding the suffix ending 'ed'. Today we will be exploring one last rule.







Today we are going to look at one final rule:

Words ending in an 'e'

bake → ~~bake~~ → bak + ed → baked

remove the letter 'e' add 'ed'
