Reception Classes/Family groups

Children will be split into two Classes:

Reception A

Reception B

Children will only be registered in those groups.

Within the first three weeks the children will be allocated a family group.

Groups will be decided based on friendships, preferred learning styles and need (*Parents will be informed when the groups are established*).

The children will then get to name their family group.

Discreet teaching of phonics and maths will take place in these groups once good learning behaviours have been established.





It is important to note that the family groups will remain fluid according to the needs of the children, which means they may change around a little throughout the year. But please be reassured that if this happens parents will be informed of any changes.

- Tapestry. Please fill out the Tapestry form as soon as possible. Your child can then post messages/pictures/videos on Tapestry over the summer. They can introduce themselves to their new teachers and show them what they like to do.
- Parent/carer discussions. Please sign up for a telephone meeting with your child's teacher using the form on the website. These will be taking place w/c 5th July 2021.

What else do we need from you?

- All uniform and clothing must have a name label (including shoes).
- To ensure your child has good attendance and punctuality at school.
- Please make sure you send your child into school with a labelled water bottle to be refilled during the day, and taken home each evening to be washed.
- To ensure your child is toilet trained, unless your child has an underlying medical need (You will need to speak to the school SENCO about this).
- Please try and make sure your child can button up/zip up their own coat.
