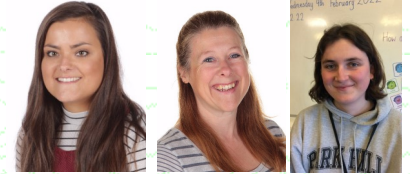

English

This term we will be focusing on a variety of genres including information texts and alternative story versions using *The Clue is in the Poo*, *Animal Antics* and *Fantastic Mr Fox*. We will be reading a class book to promote a love of reading and continuing to develop or fluency, phonics and spelling skills.

Maths

In Maths this term we are continuing to look at Multiplication and Division and moving onto to focus on fractions of numbers, quantities and shapes. This will combine with fluency activities to embed addition and subtraction knowledge from last term. We encourage the children to explain and reason how they got their answers and work on problem solving

Reading

Please encourage your child to read at least three times a week at home, for at least 15 minutes each time. We will be sending reading records home again for you to comment on your child's reading.

Reading books can be changed daily.



Phonics

We are continuing to focus on phonics and learn new sounds. Year one are continuing to embed phase 5 sounds in preparation for the phonics screening and year two are focusing on alternative sounds and spellings. Please continue to play games and explore phonics at home to support their learning in school.
