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Cookridge Primary School: Child Protection

The safety of children is our number 1 priority!

Our school is committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all children, staff and visitors. In order to sustain high levels of safeguarding, visitors and volunteers are expected to share this commitment. If you are concerned about a child and would like to speak to someone please speak to a Designated Officer.



Reception Classes/Family groups

Within the first three weeks the children will be allocated a family group.
Groups will be decided based on friendships, preferred learning styles and need (*Parents will be informed when the groups are established*).
The children will then get to name their family group.

Discreet teaching of phonics and maths will take place in these groups once good learning behaviours have been established.





It is important to note that the family groups will remain fluid according to the needs of the children, which means they may change around a little throughout the year. But please be reassured that if this happens parents will be informed of any changes.

Celebrating Success

We use an online profiling system called Tapestry. This programme allows you to access to your child's learning profile. In addition you can add your own observations of learning and experiences that take place outside of school.

To see your child's profile, you must provide us with the email addresses of everyone you'd like to access it. A form is available on our website that enables you to provide us with this information.

Over the course of the year we will aim to hold workshops directed at supporting parents with children's learning, for example, How to use Tapestry and Phonics, followed by Achieving the early learning goal in writing, later on in the year.



Beehive (Before and After school club)

Breakfast Club: Before School Club is from 7.30am – 8.40am. Breakfast is provided for all children within classrooms should they wish to partake. After School: After School is from 3.20pm – 5.45pm. •We will provide a snack at 4pm with a drink.

There will be activities at the After School Club such as art, craft, board games, ICT, play and (weather permitting) outdoor activities. We will also provide an area for reading and homework.


School Uniform




What else do we need from you?


- 50/50 Partnership
- All uniform and clothing must have a name label (including shoes).
- To ensure your child has good attendance and punctuality at school.
- To ensure your child is toilet trained, unless your child has an underlying medical need (You will need to speak to the school SENCO about this).
- Please try and make sure your child can button up/zip up their own coat.
- On Forest School days, please make sure you send your child into school with a pair of named Wellies in a separate bag. You will be given notice of when these days will be.
- The correct uniform please check the website. Only the uniform outlined on the website is part of the official uniform. Your child's team point colour will indicate what colour PE kit they will need.
- Book bags we use bags for providing reading books and for children's work. Please ensure your child has one.
