
- We would like all children to read at least 3 times a week at home with an adult, if possible.





Parent Guide Learners with different needs How can I hide the timer? Start a game and press 0 > Hide Practice Clock. You could also play a game in James per Single player > Garage > press the little arrow below "play solo" > choose 1, 2 or 3 minutes. Make sure your child is playing in Garage or Arena game modes. If this does not resolve the losse, please speak to your child's teacher. Remember that Jamming mode allows the child to choose the tables themselves. 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
