Costs

£300 (£150 for Pupil Premium)

What do you get for your money?

- Transport

How do I pay?

All Year 6 children will have 'Weardale Residential' added to their Parent Pay account for the full amount. As soon as **£60** is deposited towards the amount, your child's place will be booked. **A deposit must be made by 1st December 2025.**

Full payment must be made before the residential.

Is it safe?

- Highly trained instructors
- All activities at least 1:6 adult child ratio
- Some activities 1:4
- Risk assessed
- School staff in constant contact with the school

What about individual needs?

- Allergies
- Asthma
- Homesickness
- Bed wetting

Drop Off and Pick Up

- Children should be dropped off as normal and enter school as normal. They should arrive in their clothing ready for activities when we get to Weardale. We will be setting off after registration.
- We aim to return for home time. We will communicate back with school if this is likely to be different (traffic etc.)
- All pupils must be picked up – they will not have permission to walk home alone on this day.
